Margaret Woods, MD, CCFP, FCFP has been a family physician for over 30 years. She received her Bachelor of Social Work and medical degree from McMaster University where she also completed her family medicine residency program. Originally from Thunder Bay, she practiced in Hamilton for 17 years in a group family practice with a focus on geriatrics, completing a family medicine fellowship in geriatrics.
